## New tenants at Beckwith Park

While it may seem that there is little change on the outside, Beckwith Park in Nuriootpa has been working on a number of significant concepts to deliver its plans to establish a regional business hub.

The first of these projects is the refurbishment of the foyer area of the well know Kaiser Stuhl that fronts Tanunda Road.

With this brings new tenants Country Home Advocacy Project (CHAP) and Stockwell Storage.

Beckwith Park Chief Executive Jeremy Blanks said "Our timing and decision to invest in the building refurbishment was well suited, with Country Home Advocacy Project (CHAP) looking to consolidate a number of their offices into a single, central location that provides a professional working environment for staff and clients at about the time

we were planning our refurbishment works."

CHAP is an independent non-government organisation that was originally set up in 1989 to offer a variety of assistance and community care programs for older people and their carers. CHAP have a particular focus on assisting people in Gawler, the Barossa Valley, Wakefield Plains, Lower North and Yorke Peninsula.

Stockwell Storage will start operation from Beckwith Park, in addition to their Stockwell facility.

Mr Blanks said they recognised the need for a contract warehousing service at Beckwith Park in order to best serve the objective of becoming a regional business hub.

Beckwith Park is now 90 per cent occupied and is home to in excess of 25 businesses. A limited number of tenancy options are still available.
